The following items are derived directly from official Savannah Police Department reports and spokesmen.

## Plan of Services A RESOLUTION ADOPTING A PLAN OF SERVICES FOR THE ANNEXATION OF SALTILLO EXTENSION 1 BY THE CITY OF SALTILLO, TENNESSEE

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated 6-51-102 requires that a plan of services be adopted by the municipal governing body prior to a passage of an annexation ordinance (or prior to the passage of a resolution calling for a referendum of and annexation), and

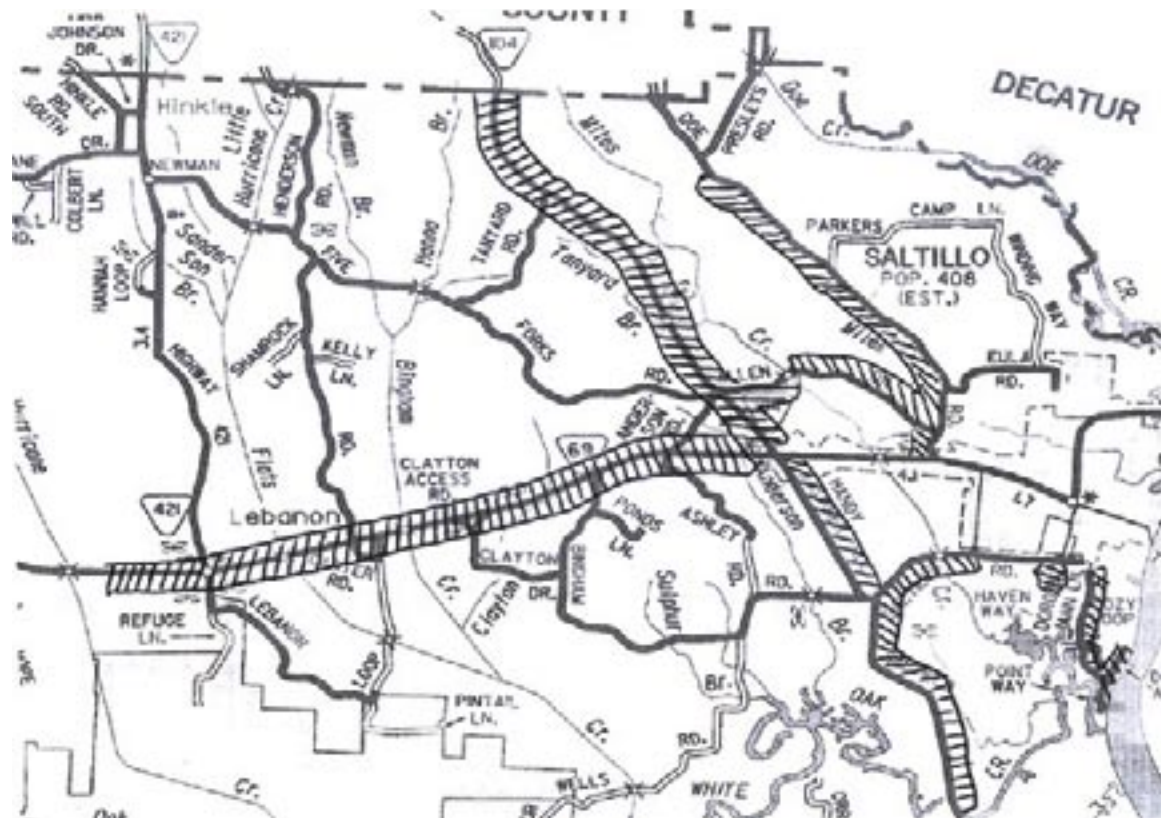
WHEREAS, the area for annexation to the City of Saltillo is within the City of Saltillo's Urban Growth Boundary, as required by law, and is described as follows:

SEE ATTACHED MAP AND DESCRIPTIONS

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMAN OF THE CITY OF SALTILLO, TENNESSEE:

Section 1. Pursuant to the provisions of T.C.A. 6-51-102, there is hereby adopted, for the area bounded as described above, the following plan of services:

- A. Police  
Patrol, response to calls, and other routine police services, using present personnel and equipment, will be provided on the effective date of annexation.
  - B. Fire Services  
Primary fire protection by the Saltillo Volunteer Fire Department, within the limitations of available water and distances from fire stations, will be provided on the effective date of annexation. Secondary or backup services will be provided upon request from the Saltillo Volunteer Fire Department by the Hardin County Fire Department.
  - C. Streets  
Routine maintenance, on the same basis as the existing city, will begin in the annexed area when state shared street aid funds begin to be received on the annexed population. (July 1 following the annexation of effective date.)
  - D. Inspections and Code Enforcement  
Any inspection services now conducted by the city (building, plumbing, electrical, gas, housing, sanitation, etc.) will begin in the annexed area on the effective date of annexation.
  - E. Planning and Zoning  
The planning and zoning jurisdiction of the city will extend to the annexed area on the effective date of annexation. City planning jurisdiction and regulation will thereafter encompass the entirety of the annexed area.
  - F. Street Lighting  
Street lights will be installed in substantially developed commercial and residential areas as needed and determined by the City of Saltillo.
  - G. Recreation  
Residents of the annexed area may use all city recreational facilities, parks, ball fields, community centers, etc. on the effective date of annexation.
- THIS RESOLUTION SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE FROM AND AFTER ITS ADOPTION.



**HIGHWAY 69**  
Beginning at a point in the current town limits 500 feet southeast of the intersection of the southern right of way state highway 69 and the western right of way of Handy Corner Road and then in a southwesterly direction along a line 500 feet south of the southern right of way of state highway 69 to a point of intersection with the western urban growth boundary of the Town of Saltillo, then north along the boundary of the urban growth boundary crossing state highway 69 to a point 500 feet north of the northern right of way of state highway 69, then in a northeasterly direction along a line 500 feet north of the northern right of way of state highway 69 to a point in the current town limits.

**HIGHWAY 104 AND ALLEN ROAD**  
Beginning at a point in the current town limits located 500 feet east of the eastern right of way of state highway 104, then in a northwesterly direction along a line 500 feet east of the eastern right of way of state highway 104 to a point 500 feet south of the southern right of way of Allen Road, then in a northeasterly direction along a line 500 feet south of the southern right of way of Allen Road to a point 50 feet west of the center of Miles Creek and 500 feet south of the southern right of way of Allen Road, then in a northwesterly direction along a line 50 feet west of the center of Miles Creek to a point in the southern right of way of Allen Road, then in a southwesterly direction along the south right of way of Allen Road to a point 500 feet east of the eastern right of way of state highway 104, then in a northwesterly direction along a line 500 feet east of the eastern right of way of state highway 104 crossing Allen Road to a point 500 feet east of the eastern right of way of state highway 104 to the Hardin County boundary line, then in a westerly direction along the Hardin County boundary line to a point 500 feet west of the western right of way of state highway 104, then in a southeasterly direction along a line 500 feet west of the western right of way of state highway 104 to a point located 500 feet west of the western right of way of state highway 104 and in the northern right of way of state highway 69, then in an easterly direction along the northern right of way of state highway 69 to the current town limits.

**DOE ROAD AND ALLEN ROAD**  
Beginning at a point where the current town limits intersect with the western right of way of Doe Road, then along the western right of way of Doe Road to a point in the western right of way of Doe Road and the northern boundary of parcel 2.03 on map 004 of the Hardin County property tax maps dated September 2005, then along the western boundary of parcel 2.03 to a point 500 feet south of the right of way of Doe Road, then in a southeasterly direction along a line 500 feet of the western right of way of Doe Road to a point 500 feet west of the western right of way of Doe Road and 500 feet north of the northern right of way of Allen Road, then in a westerly direction along a line 500 feet north of the northern right of way of Allen Road to a point in the western boundary line of parcel 10.01 on map 011 of the Hardin County property tax maps dated September 2005, then in a southerly direction along the western boundary line of parcel 10.01 to the northern right of way of Allen Road, then in an easterly direction along the northern right of way of Allen Road to a point in the northern right of way of Allen Road that is directly north of the northwest corner of parcel 35 on map 011 of the Hardin County property tax maps dated September 2005, then in a southerly direction crossing Allen Road and along the western boundary lines of parcels 35, 35.06, 35.04 and 35.05 on map 011 of the Hardin County property tax maps dated September 2005, to a point in the current town limits.

**HANDY CORNER ROAD**  
Beginning at a point in the eastern right of way of Handy Corner Road where the eastern right of way of Handy Corner Road intersects with the current town limits, then in a southeasterly direction along the eastern right of way of Handy Corner Road to the northern right of way of Bingham Road, then along the northern right of way of Bingham Road and Saltillo Road to a point 500 feet east of the eastern right of way of Handy Corner Road, then in a northwesterly direction along a line 500 feet east of the eastern right of way of Handy Corner Road to a point in the current town limits.

**SALTILLO ROAD**  
Beginning at a point where the current town limits intersect with the eastern right of way of Willis Street, then in a southerly direction crossing Saltillo Road to a point 500 feet south of the southern right of way of Saltillo Road, then in a southwesterly direction along a line 500 feet south and east of the southern and eastern right of way of Saltillo Road to a point 50 feet north of the center of White Oak Creek then in a southwesterly direction along a line 50 feet north of the center of White Oak Creek to a point in the eastern right of way of Saltillo Road, then following the eastern right of way Saltillo Road to a point in the eastern right of way of Saltillo Road directly south of the intersection of the current town limits and the western right of way of Willis Street, then in a northerly direction crossing Saltillo Road to the current town limits.

**FACTORY BUILDING**  
Beginning at a point in the current limits directly north of the northwest corner of parcel 37 on map 018 of the Hardin County property tax map dated September 2005, then in a southerly direction crossing Saltillo Road to the southwest corner of parcel 37 on map 018 of the Hardin County property tax map dated September 2005, then following the southern boundary of parcel 37 to the northwest corner of parcel 35.02 on map 018 of the Hardin County property tax map dated September 2005, then south and east following the western and southern boundaries of parcel 35.02 on map 018 of the Hardin County property tax map dated September 2005, to the southeast corner of parcel 35.02, then in a northerly direction along the eastern boundary of parcel 35.02 to the northeast corner of parcel 35.02, then in an easterly direction along the southern boundary of parcel 37 to the southeast corner of parcel 37, then in a northerly direction along the eastern boundary of parcel 37 to the northeast corner of parcel 37, then in a northerly direction crossing Saltillo Road to the current town limits.

**DOROTHY ANN LANE**  
Beginning at a point where the current town limits intersect with the eastern right of way of Dorothy Ann Lane, then in a southerly direction along the eastern right of way of Dorothy Ann Lane to a point directly west of the southwest corner of parcel 22 group "b" of map 0191 of the Hardin County property tax map dated September 2005, then in an easterly direction crossing Dorothy Ann Lane to the southwest corner of parcel 22 group "b" of map 0191 of the Hardin County property tax map dated September 2005, then in a northerly direction following the eastern property lines of parcels 22, 21, 19, 18, 17, 16, 15, 14, 13, 12, 11, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1 group "b" of map 0191 of the Hardin County property tax map dated September 2005, to the northeast corner of parcel 1 group "b" on map 0191 of the Hardin County property tax map dated September 2005, then in a northerly direction to the northeast corner of parcel 15 on map 019 of the Hardin County property tax map dated September 2005, then in an easterly direction following the northern boundary of parcel 15 to the northeast corner of parcel 15, then in a northwesterly direction to the northeast corner of parcel 15.01 on map 019 of the Hardin County property tax map dated September 2005, then in a westerly direction following the north boundary of parcel 15.01 to the northwest corner of parcel 15.01, then in a southerly direction along the western boundary of parcels 15.01, 5.01, 13, 14, map 019 and group "A" parcels 26, 25, 24, 23, 22, 20, 19.01, 19, 18, and 17 on map 0191 of the Hardin County property tax map dated September 2005, to the southwest corner of parcel 17 group "A" on map 0191 of the Hardin County property tax map dated September 2005, then in a northeasterly direction crossing Cozy Lane to the southeast corner of parcel 37 group "A" of map 019P of the Hardin County property tax map dated September 2005, then in a northerly direction along the eastern boundary of parcel 37 group "A" map 019P of the Hardin County property tax map dated September 2005, to a point where the northern boundary of parcel 41 intersects with the eastern right of way of Cozy Lane, then in a northwesterly direction crossing Cozy Lane to a point in the western right of way of Cozy Lane, then in a northwesterly direction following the western right of way of Cozy Lane to a point where it intersects with the northeast corner of parcel 35 group "A" on map 018M of the Hardin County property tax map dated September 2005, then in a northeasterly direction crossing Cozy Lane to the southeast corner of parcel 37 group "A" of map 019P of the Hardin County property tax map dated September 2005, then in a northeasterly direction along the western boundary of parcel 5.04 on map 019 of the Hardin County property tax map dated September 2005, then in a northerly direction to the northeast corner of parcel 12.01 on map 019, then in a northerly direction to the southeast corner of parcel 11 on map 019 of the Hardin County property tax map dated September 2005, then in a northerly direction along the eastern boundary of parcel 11 on map 019 to the northeast corner of parcel 11 on map 019, then in a westerly direction along the north boundary of parcel 11 on map 019 to the current town limits.
