The purpose of this notice is to advise the public of the following proposed permit action and solicit comments and information necessary to evaluate the potential impact of the proposed activities on the aquatic environment.

Pursuant to The Tennessee Water Quality Control Act of 1977, T.C.A. §69-3-108 and Tennessee Rules, Chapter 0400-40-07, the proposed activity described below has been submitted for approval under an Aquatic Resource Alteration Permit and Section 401 Water Quality Certification. Section 401 of the Clean Water Act requires that an applicant obtain a water quality certification from the state when a federal permit is required. This notice is intended to inform interested parties of this permit application and draft permit and rationale, and to ask for comments and information necessary to determine possible impacts to water quality. At the conclusion of the public notice period a final determination will be made whether to issue or deny the permit.

LOCATION

The project is located in Indian Creek in Hardin County at three points of impact:

- Site 1 Latitude N 35.255013 Longitude W -88.010806 = 316 feet of riprap revetment to top of bank, four jetties
Site 2 Latitude N 35.249772 Longitude W -88.010714 = 273 feet of riprap revetment to top of bank
Site 3 Latitude N 35.249425 Longitude W -88.011092 = 56 feet of riprap revetment to top of bank

PROJECT DESCRIPTION / PURPOSE

The proposed activity consists of three segments of riprap revetment extending to top of bank totaling 645 feet, including four rock jetties. The purpose of the work is to stabilize bank erosion. The activity is designed and to be constructed in accordance with the NRCS conservation practices - Streambank and Shoreline Protection, Code 580, accompanied by Critical Area Planting, Code 342, Riparian Forest Buffer, Code 391 and Channel Bed Stabilization, Code 584.

ANTIDEGRADATION

The affected waters have available parameters for habitat. Indian Creek is not designated as Exceptional Tennessee Waters. As described in the accompanying permit rationale, the Department has made a preliminary determination that the proposed activity will result in de minimis degradation. Further, provided the project is constructed in full application of the Natural Resource Conservation Service (NRCS) Conservation Practice Standard 580 (Tennessee) and NRCS Engineering Field Handbook, Chapter 16 Streambank and Shoreline Protection, and subject to NRCS oversight, will not result in an appreciable permanent loss of resource value.

FACTORS CONSIDERED

In deciding whether to issue or deny this permit, the Division will consider all comments of record and the requirements of applicable federal and state laws. The division will consider the nature, scale and effects of proposed impacts. The Division will consider practicable alternatives to the alteration, loss of waters or habitat, diminishment in biological diversity, cumulative or secondary impacts to the water resource, and adverse impacts to unique, high quality, or impaired waters. In making this decision, a final determination will be made evaluating appreciable permanent loss of resource values and proposed compensatory mitigation to ensure the project will not result in net overall loss of state water resources values.

HOW TO COMMENT

TDEC is requesting public comment on this proposed permit action. Obtaining a broad range of facts and opinions on Agency actions is one of the best ways to ensure appropriate decisions. Persons wishing to comment on the proposal are invited to submit written comments to the Division. Written comments must be received within thirty days following distribution of the approved public notice materials (including signage and newspaper ad). Comments will become part of the record and will be considered in the final decision. The applicant's name and permit number should be referenced. Send all written comments to the Division's address listed below to the attention of the permit coordinator. You may also comment via email to water.permits@tn.gov.

After the Division makes a final permit determination, a permit appeal may be filed by the applicant or by any person who participated in the public comment period whose appeal is based on comments given to the Division in writing during the public comment period or in testimony at a formal public hearing.
